About the Event

Fr. Robert Pawell, OFM will present a Day of Recollection on "Going from Gospel to Life and Life to Gospel: Secular Franciscans Celebrate the Year of Consecrated Life" at St. Colette Catholic Church, 3900 Meadow Dr., Rolling Meadows. Aside from Mass, all activities will take place in Halpin Hall, located in the church's basement. About the Speaker

Fr. Robert was born in Chicago and grew up on the city's northwest side. He entered the Order of Friars Minor in 1959 and was ordained in 1966. Fr. Robert holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Philosophy and Psychology from Quincy University, Illinois; a Baccalaureate in Sacred Theology from the Pontifical University Antonianum, Rome; a Master's Degree in Pastoral Studies from Loyola University Chicago, Institute of Pastoral Studies; and a Certificate in Spiritual Direction from the Institute for Spiritual Leadership, Chicago. After 20 years of working in a variety of ministries around the country, in 1996 he returned to Chicago, where he cofounded Holy Evangelists Friary on Ashland Ave. He is currently the Director of Programs at St. Peter's Church in the Loop, and also serves as confessor, preacher and Eucharistic minister. On weekends, he assists at St. Bonaventure Oratory in Chicago.

Fr. Robert is an experienced spiritual director, parish mission preacher, retreat director and preacher, and days of recollection speaker for priests, religious, and laity. In his preaching, he makes use of poetry and story, the wisdom of saints and mystics, and insights from contemporary psychology to illuminate the Good News of the Gospel.
