This ministry packs bags of nutritious grain for those living in the poorest and most destitute areas on our planet. Members of our fraternity will participate in this work of service every other month from 2:30 to 4:00 p.m.

It is mindboggling to think that for the lack of a measly 29 cents a day, a child will starve.

Also needed: underwear, socks, short sleeve tops, shorts, lightweight pants and jackets.
