Beginning on September 1st, we begin the Season of Creation which ends on October 4th, the Feast of St. Francis. On September 17th, we celebrate the 800th Anniversary of the Stigmata of St. Francis. The theme for this Season of Creation is: "To Hope and Act with Creation".

In our current St. Anthony Messenger on page 18, in the article *One Simple Word*, it states: "Thus, the simple word within this year's theme (*with*) is so important because it reminds us that we are not stewards over, we do not hold dominion over, but rather we act *with* and live *with* creation. And this is our greatest hope to be of a mindset to embrace the mutuality of creation in its totality-human, plant, and animal alike." And lastly...the last paragraph of the article states: "As the Franciscan Federation continues to grow as an inclusive space for all who identify as Franciscan, we, too, believe deeply in this call to mutuality, and we do our best to practice it. The mutuality extends to all of creation, but in a particular way—given the political climate in the United States this fall—it must also help us navigate difficulties with others. In many ways, it has become easy to see creation as the environment that cries out for our attention and care; but creation also includes all of humanity, whether we agree with each other or not. And so I call us during this Season of Creation to remember our humanity, to view it as a sign of creation, and for each of us to hope and act with all of creation." *By Sara Marks*. Loose change wanted - at each monthly fraternity gathering, fraternity members have an opportunity to donate their loose change so that we can provide the funds to feed a child for a year. Whenever a total of \$53 in change is collected, it will be matched by \$53 from our Common Fund for a total of \$106, the cost of feeding a starving child in another country for a year.

HOPEFUL BEGINNINGS

The next collection for Hopeful Beginnings will be at our **October** gathering. This will be a collection of clothes and baby items needed for fall and winter.

September is a great month for garage sales. Check out ones in your neighborhood for children's clothing in good condition. Look especially for winter jackets which can be very expensive. Sometimes these can be found at a garage sale for 10% or 20% of what they would cost in a store, even Walmart or Target. It can be a great way to provide much needed clothing for very little cost.

Specific needs for babies and toddlers:

diapers - sizes 3T, 4T, 5T, lotions and soaps (hypoallergenic, if possible), wash cloths, towels, formula, lotions, soap, bibs.

Clothing for Boys and Girls: Most needed sizes are 3T, 4T, 5T

Size 2T and 3T pants and jeans for boys are rarely donated (boys wear out the knees) Snug-fitted foot cotton pajamas, loose-fit footed pajamas, jeans, pants, tops, Also needed: underwear, socks, short sleeve tops, shorts, lightweight pants and jackets.
