We welcomed a guest, Alexander, and look forward to his joining our gatherings again in the coming months.

Looking forward to this month's gathering, it is with joyous anticipation that we prepare for the celebration of

the Mass of Profession for Candidates Mary and Tim, which will take place at 7:00 p.m. in the chapel at St. Joseph's Home. **There will not be ongoing formation this month.**
