# **Common Fund Report**

At the end of **April**, the balance in our Common Fund was **\$1,454.69**. As a result of new policies at the bank where we have our account, a \$12 charge was incurred because the balance was under the new monthly minimum of \$1,500. This will occur every month as long as the balance is below \$1,500, which means that we could spend as much as \$144 a year just in bank fees.

Thank you to our Treasurer, Brother Tom, who contacted the bank several times by phone and in person to see if our nonprofit status could negate the fee. Despite his efforts, there is no change in the bank's policy or its effect on us.

One-hundred and forty-four dollars can go a long way toward the projects we hold dear to our hearts as Secular Franciscans eager to help others. Please consider this when donating to the Common Fund each month. As with our personal bank accounts, there should be enough in reserve in our Common Fund to allow for unanticipated monthly expenses without incurring penalties.  $\blacksquare$

# **Keeping in Touch**

Our Infirmarian, Sister Jackie, received the following note from Sister Mary Joan, which we're sharing with all. Please see Sister Jackie for more information.

"Greetings for Springtime, but especially Pentecost and Corpus Christi ... I'm still hoping you can make a visit during this nice weather. Our first floor of the building has been reorganized, everything from a larger library, reel room and dining area to a new building that includes a swimming pool! ...

"Lovingly in Christ, Mary Joan"

A similar invitation was given to me by Sister Eddie, last month. Sister Eddie was my mentor during Candidacy and became a role model of how I wanted to live my years as a Secular Franciscan. When she moved to Clare Oaks, I felt the loss. As many of you know, my ability to drive anywhere at any time has been limited.

Enter the Holy Spirit.

When I learned that the formation meetings for the St. Bernadine of Siena fraternity are held at Clare Oaks on the second Friday of the month in the evening, I bummed a ride from Brother Jerry (St. Bernardine of Siena, Wayne).

Sister Eddie has a lovely apartment furnished with all her cherished belongings in a beautiful facility. As we sat and talked, she related that several years ago, her daughters approached her about her choices in a retirement residence should the need arise at a time when she wasn't capable of making such a decision. She said that the only one with which she had experience was Clare Oaks, because when she could drive, she would visit her friend, Marion, who lived there until she passed away eight months ago. She added that Marion, also a Secular Franciscan, had been instrumental in Sister Eddie's Franciscan vocation.

Then she said that she had visited several other residences and apartments, and when she visited Clare Oaks, the coordinator took her to the first apartment on the list. When she entered the empty apartment, it looked familiar. The coordinator checked and found that it had been Sister Marion's apartment. That clinched it. Another Secular is now living in that apartment.

On the way home, I was relating this to Brother Jerry when he said, "Oh, Marion. She was in my fraternity." Not only that, but his initial formation was held in Sister Marion's apartment, after which she would join the group in praying the Liturgy of the Hours.

That's not all.

As I related the story at our fraternity council meeting, our Treasurer, Brother Tom, well remembered Sister Marion, and our Spiritual Assistant, Brother Patrick, added that when he served as Regional Minister, Sister Marion and her husband, Maurice (also a Secular Franciscan), were given a national award as a couple who most exemplified the Secular Franciscans. The National Minister came to the Mother Cabrini Regional celebration that year and to present the award to them.

# Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

On May 13, 1917, the Blessed Mother appeared to three young children who were tending sheep in the Cova da Iria, Fatima, Portugal. On the 13th of each month through October 1917, she appeared to them and told them that it was the wish of Her Son that devotion to her Immaculate Heart be established in the world. She said that the world was to be consecrated to her Immaculate Heart.

Pope Pius XII solemnly consecrated the Church and the whole world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on the eve of All Saints in 1942 (see below). In May 1943, in the midst of World War II, the Pope urged Catholics to invoke the intercession of Mary and consecrate themselves to her Immaculate Heart. In 1945 the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary was established and was to be solemnly celebrated each year throughout the world. The feast would promote devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary so that all nations might enjoy peace and religious liberty, sinners could be converted and virtue among all the faithful would increase.

The words of consecration written over seventy years ago echo the state of our world today.

# Consecration of Mankind to the Immaculate Heart of Mary by Pope Pius XII

Queen of the most holy rosary, Refuge of the human race, Victress in all God's battles, we humbly prostrate ourselves before your throne, confident that we shall have mercy, grace, bountiful assistance, and protection in the present calamity, not through our own inadequate merits, but solely through the great goodness of your maternal heart.

To you, to your Immaculate heart in this, humanity's tragic hour, we consign and consecrate ourselves in union not only with the mystical body of your Son, Holy Mother Church, now in such suffering and agony in so many places and sorely tried in so many ways, but also with the entire world, torn by fierce strife, consumed in a fire of hate, victim of its own wickedness.

May the sight of the widespread material and moral destruction, of the sorrows and anguish of countless fathers and mothers, husbands and wives, brothers and sisters, and innocent children, of the great number of lives cut off in the flower of youth, of the bodies mangled in horrible slaughter, and of the tortured and agonized souls in danger of being lost eternally, move you to compassion.

O Mother of Mercy, obtain peace for us from God and above all procure for us those graces which prepare, establish, and assure the peace.

Queen of Peace, pray for us and give to the world now at war the peace for which all people are longing, peace in the truth, justice, and charity of Christ. Give peace to the warring nations and to the souls of men, that in the tranquility of order the kingdom of God may prevail.

Extend your protection to the infidels and to all those still in the shadow of death; give them peace and grant that on them, too, may shine the sun of truth, that they may unite with us in proclaiming before the one and only Savior of the world: "Glory to God in the highest and peace to men of good will."

Give peace to the peoples separated by error or by discord and especially to those who profess such singular devotion to you, and in whose homes an honored place was ever accorded your venerated icon (today perhaps often kept hidden to await better days). Bring them back to the one fold of Christ under the one true Shepherd.

Obtain peace and complete freedom for the holy Church of God; stay the spreading flood of modern paganism; enkindle in the faithful the love of purity, the practice of the Christian life, and an apostolic zeal, so that the servants of God may increase in merit and in number.

Lastly, as the Church and the entire human race were consecrated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, so that in reposing all hope in Him, He might become for them the sign and pledge of victory and salvation; so we in like manner consecrate ourselves forever also to you and to your immaculate heart, our Mother and Queen, that your love and patronage may hasten the triumph of the kingdom of God and that all nations, at peace with one another and with God, may proclaim you blessed and with you may raise their voices to resound from pole to pole in the chant of the everlasting magnificat of glory, love, and gratitude to the Heart of Jesus, where alone they can find truth and peace.
