MOTHER CABRINI

Mother Cabrini, the patroness of our Region, is a model of obedience to authority. She had to be very perplexed when she petitioned Pope Leo XIII to allow her and her sisters to go to China and work as missionaries. Instead he told her to go to the United States and work among the predominantly Catholic Italian immigrants already there. Surely, this was not the idea of missionary work she had cherished in her dreams for many years.

The result of her obedience was the establishment of 67 orphanages, schools and hospitals. Her love -for the poor, the orphaned, the sick - triumphed in the face of many challenges. **T**
