LETTING GOD

If we don't, we may not be in the right place at the right time. A lesson taught once again to your minister.

The plan was to spend Thursday at home getting everything ready for a flurry of errands with my daughter on Friday with everything in order: bank deposits, grocery list, coupons, list of items for the Outreach bags, etc. We'd leave bright and early in the morning well organized. Thursday morning a client called my daughter and changed her date to watch the dogs from Thursday to Friday. She had stayed up to watch the last game of the World Series and was working from home.

I wasn't ready for any of it. But my daughter was free. By the time the deposit slip was made out and the lists, it was almost noon. Not good in my mind.

At the Dollar Tree store in Rolling Meadows, my daughter was helping me get items that were hard to reach. Even she was having a time of it. A driver who was stocking bread came to our rescue. He was curious why we needed so many lip balms. My daughter explained it was for the homeless. The driver asked if we could use bread for the homeless. He was just going to throw it out as instructed.

Not for them, but St. Joseph's Home probably could. He was happy to give us 37 packages of bread, bagels, rolls, cinnamon bread, which the staff at St. Joseph's was happy to receive.

It's a little thing, but...had I not gone shopping until Friday, or even been in the store as early as I had wanted to be, that never would have happened.

Lesson learned.
