May the grace of the Holy Spirit, the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and our holy father Saint Francis, and the **fraternal bonds of community** always be my help, so that I may reach the goal of perfect Christian love.

These were the words each of us personally spoke on the day of our profession. We committed to a way of life governed by the rules of the Secular Franciscan community.

The words of our National Minister, Jan Parker, OFS, in her eulogy of Deacon Tom Bello, OFS, former National Minister, best express the promise each of us makes on our profession day when we make a lifelong commitment to the Secular Franciscan Order. "We live with our families and work out in the world, but gather regularly with our Franciscan brothers and sisters in our local fraternities. It is there that we are formed and transformed, as we strive for ongoing daily conversion."

We cannot be a member of the secular Franciscans in isolation. We committed to a way of life governed by the rules of the secular Franciscan community. In Article 30 of the General Constitutions of the Secular Franciscan Order, we are told:

- 1. The brothers and sisters are co-responsible for the life of the fraternity to which they belong and for the OFS as the organic union of all fraternities throughout the world.
- 2. The sense of co-responsibility of the members requires personal presence, witness, prayer and active collaboration, in accordance with each one's situation

and possible obligations for the animation of the fraternity.

3. Rule 25 In a family spirit, each brother and sister should make a contribution to the fraternity fund, according to each one's means, to provide the financial means needed for the life of the fraternity and for its religious, apostolic, and charitable works. The brothers and sisters ought to provide the means necessary for supporting the activities and the operations of the fraternities at higher levels, both by their financial assistance and by their contributions in other areas as well.

The Calendar for 2017 is included in this newsletter. Let us all sit down with our cell phones, wall calendars, or appointment books or whatever we use to keep track of commitments and mark off the twelve days when we will gather as fraternity as **definite commitments**.

At some point in all our lives, we experience serious illness an unforeseen family crisis, or some other occasion which is rare and will conflict with our fraternity gatherings. That is Beyond these, nothing understood. should take precedence over gathering with our brothers and sisters. commitment is only one day of each month – 12 days in a year of 365 days. get-togethers, Family "grandchild activities, attendance at parish meetings and programs, social obligations should be scheduled or attended to on any of the other days in the month. The activities we choose indicate our priorities.

In the Gospel, we read that "the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant seeking beautiful pearls, who, when he had found one pearl of great price, went and sold all that he had and bought it." Each of us during formation spent much in time and perseverance because we had found that pearl of great price in our vocation. We purchased it with our profession. Let us keep its luster forever gleaming by our commitment to the rules we promised to obey. Our unwavering dedication will evangelize our families and friends who will come to realize that the profession we made is vastly different than membership in the Ladies Sodality or the Men's Club.

We are family. Just as our families are strengthened by being with each other regularly and the more often the better, so, too, with our Franciscan family. The reality is that we grow stronger in our commitment as seculars by our attendance. And even though at times we may not "feel" that we have benefited from our attendance at fraternity, we will never know the impact our just being there or something we said or did may have on one of our brothers and sisters.

- 3. the cost of the items used in our Franciscan Outreach Gift bags which was not covered by free will donations for the project.

The bank's increase from \$1,000 to \$1,500 as the minimum amount needed in the account to avoid monthly fees does not help.
