Emergency Contact Information

Please provide the name, relationship to you, and phone number of the person who should be contacted if you are ever unable to contact us yourself. The information can be emailed to the minister or given to her at the May fraternity meeting. All information will be held in strict confidentiality and only used by a council member when absolutely necessary. **T**

Meeting Sister Death

In the General Constitutions, Article 27:2 "Secular Franciscans should commit themselves to create in their environment and, above all, in their fraternities, a climate of faith and hope so that "Sister Death" may be regarded as a passage to the Father, and all may prepare themselves with serenity.

When a brother or sister meets Sister Death, the fraternity members will always pray for their companion and share fond memories. If the brother or sister wishes, as many members as are available will participate in a Franciscan wake service during the visitation."

Together with this newsletter is the form which gives specific instructions regarding your

wishes as to what should be done by the fraternity when you die.

If you have already filled out this form, you need not do so again *unless* contact information needs to be updated.

Those professed in the last several years should review the form and determine what your wishes are.

Each fraternity member is **responsible for keeping the contact information current and communicating your wishes to your family members.** Make sure that the person you designate to act for you when you cannot do so yourself, is aware of your wishes. **T**
