What a jam packed evening we all enjoyed at our August fraternity gathering. There was a spirited discussion of Chapter 4, Christ's Wounds of Mercy, The Holy Year of Mercy by Pope Francis. We focused on the Gospel of St. John describing Jesus' appearance to the disciples on Easter Sunday. He calmed their fears by saying "Peace be with you" and then showing them his wounded hands and side to prove that he was truly alive, and not an apparition. Not a word was said about where they were the previous Friday. Instead Jesus continues to focus on their mission. "As the Father has sent me, even so I send you." Jesus reassures his disciples that despite their denials and their fear, they are still his chosen messengers to the world. He acknowledges the weakness of their humanity and assures them it doesn't matter. After all, God gave them that humanity. And us. Brother Marc Sheckells, OFM, the regional spiritual assistant, joined us and presided at the Rite of Installation of our Spiritual Assistant, Brother Jerry. As his first official act as our spiritual assistant, Brother Jerry presided at the admission of Gail into candidacy. Congratulations to Brother Jerry and to Gail, as both begin walking different paths in Franciscan spirituality.

Father Francis died lying on the ground outside his beloved Portiuncula, the Chapel of Our Lady of the Angels, which is in the valley below Assisi. His tomb is in the lower level of the Basilica of St. Francis in Assisi, Italy.

All brothers and sisters are required to attend as we will *not* be gathering on the second Monday, as we would usually do.

All professed are to gather in the library at St. Joseph's Home at 6:30 p.m. for formation. Please read Chapter 5, Compassion: The Touch of Mercy in *The Holy Year of Mercy* and complete the sections: Understand, Grow, Reflect, Act.

After formation, we will gather in the chapel to celebrate the Ritual of Transitus, which will be followed by social time. **T**
